

Recognised remedies in complementary medicine

under SANA (in accordance with AIC paragraph 2.2) and COMPLETA (in accordance with AIC paragraph 10.2) Status: 01. January 2021

Basic principle:

Helsana covers 75% of the costs of recognised complementary medical remedies, provided that such remedies are prescribed, supplied or administered by a recognised service provider as part of complementary medical treatment. The prescription must be provided.

The following are recognised remedies:

- Swissmedic registered remedies in complementary medicine
- complementary medical remedies individually produced for the patient,
 - supplied by an authorised pharmacy or a manufacturer with a Swissmedic permit,
 - o for which the active substance(s) is/are included in the list of homeopathic and anthroposophic substances (HAS)/in the list of documented traditional Asian substances (TAS)/in the list of medicines with tariff (ALT).
- the price of the remedies is cost-effective.
- the medical necessity (clinical significance) of the remedies is demonstrated.

All products that are assigned to the list of pharmaceutical products with special uses (LPPV), e.g. nutritional supplements, vitamins, minerals, etc., are excluded.
